Elementary Discussion:

This week, kids learned in Exodus 12:1-14 that God told Moses to tell Pharaoh to let His people go. Pharaoh wanted to keep the Israelites as his slaves so he would not let them go. So God sent 10 plagues to convince Pharaoh to let His people go. Before the last plague, God told Moses to tell His people to put blood on their door frames. That way, everyone in their family would live. The Israelites obeyed and the terrible plague of death “passed over” their home. Kids learned that God’s love and protection for them is amazing. Bible Memory Verse: “The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.” Exodus 12:13

Discussion Questions:

What did you learn about the Passover?

Which plagues do you remember from the Bible lesson?

What did you learn about God’s love and protection from the Passover?

What did Jesus do for us to save us from death?

Where do you need God’s love and protection?

Prayers:

Thank God for the ways He protects you and your family.

Thank God for His amazing power.

Thank God for His love and protection.

Talk to Jesus about how you feel about what He has done for you.

Talk to God about where you need His love and protection.

Paint the Door Snacks

You’ll Need:

Crackers

Red food coloring

Whipped white icing

Do This:

Mix the red food coloring into the white icing, to make the icing as red as possible.

SAY:

In the Bible, God told His people to paint their door frames with some of the blood of their lamb. If the blood was on the door, He would pass over and no one in the house would die.

Have kids follow these steps to make their Paint the Door Snacks.

Pretend that the cracker is unleavened bread.

Paint the red icing on their cracker like painting the door.
