Trinity's Kids

Trinity is a family-friendly church, and we have many opportunities for children throughout Sunday morning.

Trinity has Nursery care for children ages 6 months and up, and Sunday School for children PreK through 6th grade beginning at 9:45 AM in the Education Building. Once Sunday School is over, children are brought to their parents in church shortly before Communion. Or children up to age 5 can remain in the Nursery until parents pick them up after the service. If you are interested in bringing your child to Sunday School or the Nursery, please see one of the Ushers to direct you to the Nursery and Sunday School classrooms.

However, if you prefer your children to be with you in church, we offer activity packets and crayons for the children, which can be found on the table in the narthex of the church. These packets include, coloring pages, mazes, word searches, etc., which pertain to the gospel reading for that day. Feel free to pick one up as you enter church.

Trinity also has a *Quiet Room* located in the back of the church that welcomes families with small children under the age of 18 months. There, parents have the benefit of participating in the service while caring for their young children.

Finally, Trinity offers a Youth Group for young adults, grades 6 through 12. The Youth Group meets on the second and fourth Sundays of the month from 5:00 to 6:30 PM. The youth have Biblical discussions, play games and have dinner. Parents are always welcome to stay!






1 Peter 3:18-22

¹⁸ For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit, ¹⁹ in which he went and proclaimed to the spirits in prison, ²⁰ because they formerly did not obey, when God's patience waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was being prepared, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were brought safely through water. ²¹ Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ²² who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers having been subjected to him.



We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,



Invitation to Communion

All baptized persons are welcome to receive Communion, and those who do not desire to receive Communion may come to the rail to receive God's blessing.

An Usher will direct you to approach the Altar for Communion or a blessing. Please kneel at the Altar.

To receive the consecrated bread, extend your hands upward, palms crossed and facing up.

To receive the consecrated wine, please guide the chalice to your lips as it is offered. However, if you prefer, you may leave the consecrated bread in your palm and the Chalice bearer will intinct the host into the wine and place it on your tongue. Please do not personally intinct the host into the chalice.

Daughters of the King 2020-2021 Outreach Project

--Sunday, February 28th

Next Sunday, February 28th, the Trinity Chapter of the Daughters of the King will be informing parishioners of the charitable work and collecting donations for the DOK Diocese of Central Florida 2020-2021 Outreach Project: No One Hungry, Inc. (NOH). In the past, Trinity has supported DOK outreach projects such as Days for Girls, Bibles for Malawi and the Estah Ministry. The mission of NOH is to reduce hunger and to give hope to those in need.

Most Americans are unaware of the impact of hunger in their community. In 2018, the organization received a "Hunger Hero Award" from Brevard County. The founder, Rev. John E. Clark is a retired executive chef who is now a Deacon in the Episcopal Diocese of Central Florida. Rev. Clark began his diaconal ministry responding to a call to see to it that senior citizens in his community had access to nutritious food. Over the years this developed into "No One Hungry", a non-profit in Titusville, Florida. Rev. Clark, affectionately known as "Deacon Johnny", is an Associate in the Order of the Holy Cross, serves as a Board Member of the Order of St. Luke and is a member of the American Culinary Federation and a Senior Certified Executive Chef. NOH is a service partner with the North Brevard Women's Center helping with food and needs of their clients. The non-profit also is the community sponsor of two elementary school food assistance programs in Brevard county, and sponsor of a high school and middle school food pantry for students. In Belize, NOH supports a community soup kitchen helping homeless with hot meals. They also administer the Dale and Marie Wolfe Scholarship in Belize helping students go on to higher education. Last year, NOH paid tuition for a woman in Belize to complete her last three courses to receive her BA degree in Education, allowing her to get a better paying job to support her family.
