Elementary Discussion:

This week, kids learned in John 18:37 that Jesus Christ is King. During His last days on earth, Jesus was arrested. When asked if He was a king, Jesus answered, "You are right in saying I am a king. In fact, for this reason I was born, and for this I came into the world." Jesus was born to be King, but His kingdom is not on this earth — it's in heaven. He only came to earth to make a way for us to live with Him in heaven. Kids learned that King Jesus looks after His people's needs and cares for them. Bible Memory Verse: "You are right in saying I am a king. In fact, for this reason, I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me." John 18:37

MONDAY:

- What stands out to you most about Jesus Christ being King?
- Thank God for sending His son Jesus to be your King.

TUESDAY:

- Is it hard or easy for you to think of Jesus as your King? Why?
- Ask God to help you remember Jesus is King of your life.

WEDNESDAY:

- How is Jesus different from other kings?
- Thank God for sending Jesus to care for his people.

THURSDAY:

- Why is taking care of people an important part of being king?
- Ask God to help you care for people like Jesus.

FRIDAY:

- How does knowing Jesus is King bring you comfort?
- Thank God for sending Jesus to be King of your life.

Crown Snacks (this week, there is also an additional snack featured on the home page below the sermon lesson)

You'll Need (use parental discretion with small items):

- Paper Plates- one per child
- Napkins- one per child
- Mini Pretzel Sticks- a few perchild
- String cheese- one per child

Do This:

- Give each child a paper plate, a napkin, some pretzel sticks, and string cheese.
- Invite kids to use their string cheese and pretzel sticks to make a crown.
- Enjoy!

SAY:

• Jesus didn't walk around with a crown on His head like other kings. He came to speak the truth and to rescue us from our sins. Christ is King!
